Poised for Growth

Leadership development and agriculture education are becoming more important with each passing year. Regulations continue to mount, the demand for agriculture products is growing as our population increases and consumers have a desire to know more about how and where their food is grown.

Missouri Farm Bureau's Foundation for Agriculture is well positioned to help provide funding for programs and activities that address these contemporary issues.

Over the past 15 years, the Foundation has grown by leaps and bounds. Today, the Foundation is supported by memorial contributions, member donations, two golf tournaments, a trap shoot, a silent auction and pancake breakfast at the MFB Annual Meeting, and a live auction at the Young Farmers and Ranchers Confer-

ence. Hundreds of employees, members and corporate partners support the Foundation and we are extremely grateful for their assistance.

Foundation funds are used in many different ways. Following the devastating tornado that struck Joplin in May, Farm Bureau county leaders and employees began asking how the Foundation could assist. Donations quickly added up and a team was put together to provide more than 1,200 free meals at the local county office. The Foundation joined the Jasper and Newton County Farm Bureaus (counties within the Joplin School District) to provide all 12 elementary schools in Joplin with a set of 31 fact-based agriculture-themed books.

And, on October 7, Farm Bureau President Blake Hurst presented Joplin School District officials with a \$25,000 check to help rebuild the district's

agriculture programs. The funds were contributed by county Farm Bureaus, members, employees and corporate partners such as Swiss Re Life & Health America.

In recent years, the Foundation has joined the University of Missouri and University Extension in sponsoring the Century Farm Program. More than 940 family farms have been recognized in the program, which honors those that have been in the same family for more than

100 consecutive years.

The Foundation provides funding for two \$1,000 scholarships to graduating veterinarians at the University of Missouri that will enter a Missouri practice that includes large animals and four \$500 scholarships for students enrolling in a vo-tech school pursuing a career that includes service to farmers and ranchers.

Funding for other scholarships is

provided at seven Missouri colleges and universities.

Two students from each of the state's seven Collegiate Farm Bureau chapters receive funding to participate in Farm Bureau's annual legislative trip to Washington, D.C., and the Foundation provides funding for the Young Farmer and Rancher Program's annual Discussion Meet, Achievement Award and Award of Excellence contests.

The Foundation also provides funding for mini-grants that allow teachers to purchase materials for agriculture-based lesson plans. To date, 480 mini-grants have been awarded to Missouri teachers.

Over the past year, the log home reconstructed at the Farm Bureau Center in Jefferson City has opened for free tours to Farm Bureau-related groups. The circa 1850 four-room, two-story, log home is used as the backdrop to tell the story of how rural life has evolved and the role Farm Bureau has played for almost 100 years. With growth comes change. In July, the MFB State Board of Directors voted unanimously to modify the Farm Bureau membership renewal form and give members a better opportunity to contribute to the Foundation for Agriculture. The new forms provide a brief explanation of Foundation programs and "suggest" a voluntary \$5 annual contribution. This is similar to the current contribution line for a member's regional FARM-PAC. The Foundation is a testament to the success that comes from many people working together towards a common goal. We have much to be proud of in agriculture and Farm Bureau and together we can continue to do amazing things for this great industry.

The Missouri Farm Bureau log home was one of four homes featured during tours of Civil War era homes in Jefferson City. The home was officially opened to tours in 2011 and several civic and school groups visited the historic structure. The home is open to grade school classes and Farm Bureau-related groups for tours by reservation only.

Reaching out to Joplin Schools

Joplin's 12 elementary schools were in need of books, so the Jasper County Farm Bureau, Newton County Farm Bureau and Missouri Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture teamed up to donate \$3,000 worth of new fact-based agriculture books. Of the dozen elementary schools in the Joplin School District, three were totally destroyed and two badly damaged by May's tornado.

A couple weeks after the donation, MFB President Blake Hurst presented a \$25,000 check to Joplin School District officials. The money was donated by Farm Bureau members, counties, employees, insurance agents and business partners and will



help expand the Memorial Campus greenhouse and its FFA program. The Franklin Technology Center, where greenhouses once stood, was destroyed by the tornado. "I hope that some of the kids are able to continue in agriculture," said Hurst. "We need young people to be interested in it."

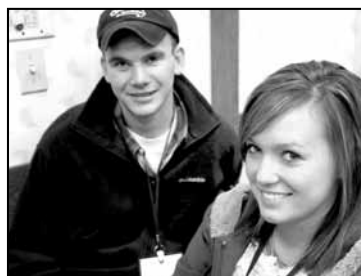
